The Paradox of Industrial Safety

Visible Hazards Drive Our Priorities



SYSTEM 1 EVENT

Fast, visible, urgent. Triggers an investigation and an ambulance.

BACKGROUND THREAT

Quiet, invisible, delayed. Lacks immediate drama and gets ignored.

Accidents trigger an immediate emotional response.
Occupational diseases do not bleed.
Because health threats lack immediate drama, they remain invisible.

Checking Boxes Is Not Safety



We have built a culture where we check boxes to look safe, without ever verifying if we are actually healthy.

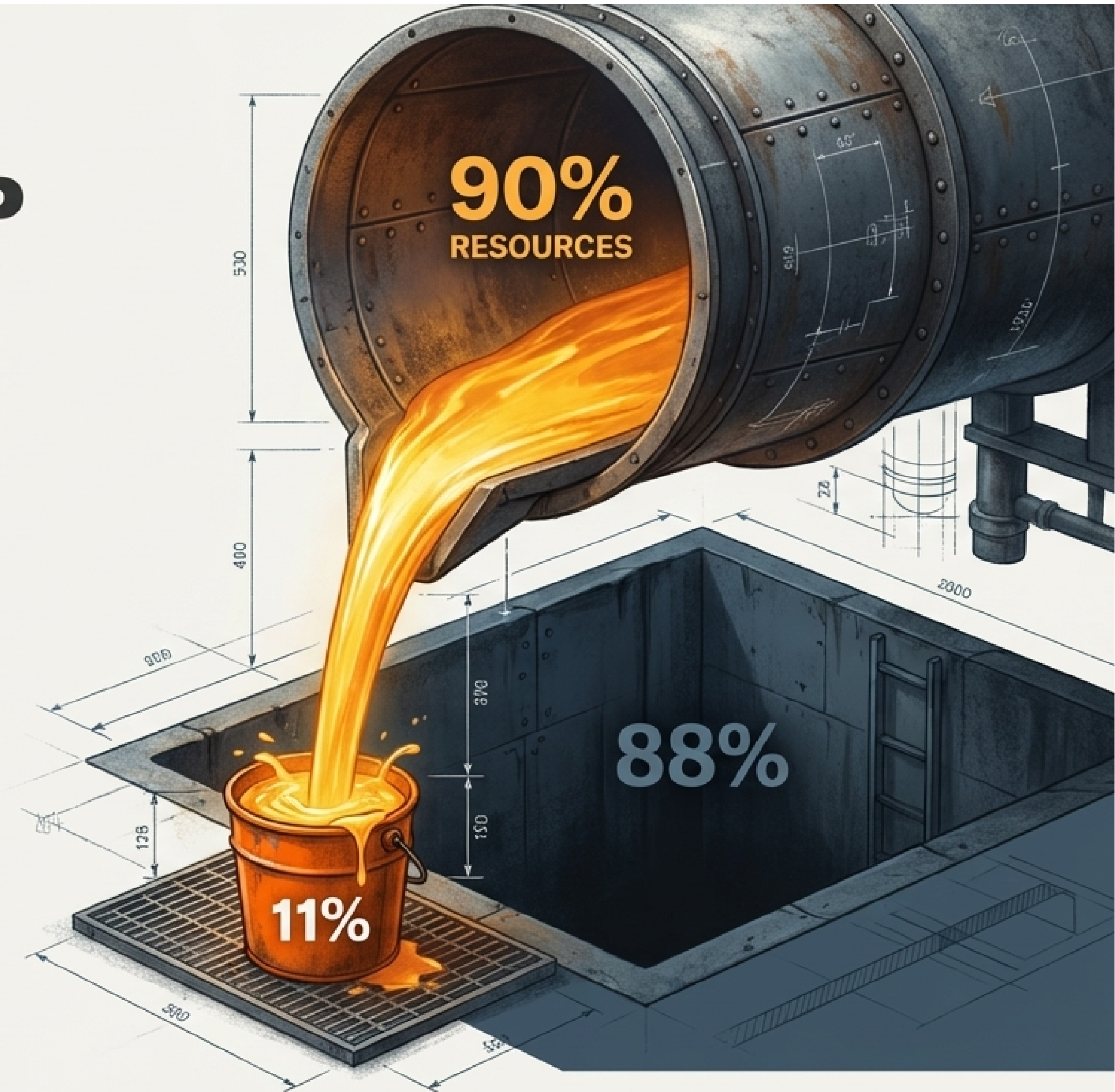

THE DEADLY COMPETENCE GAP

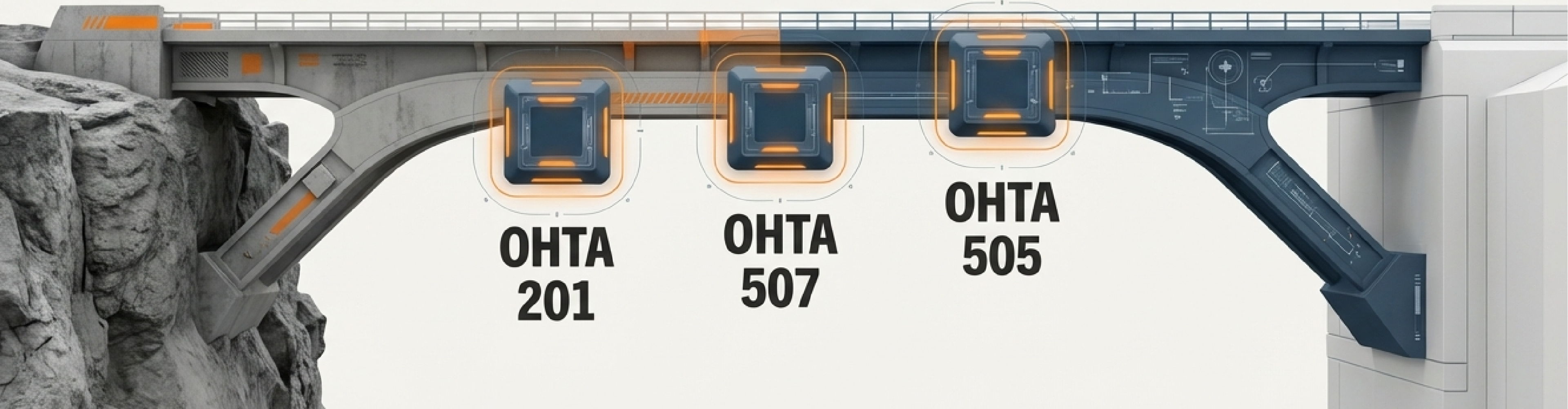
Upgrading Capability with the OHTA Framework

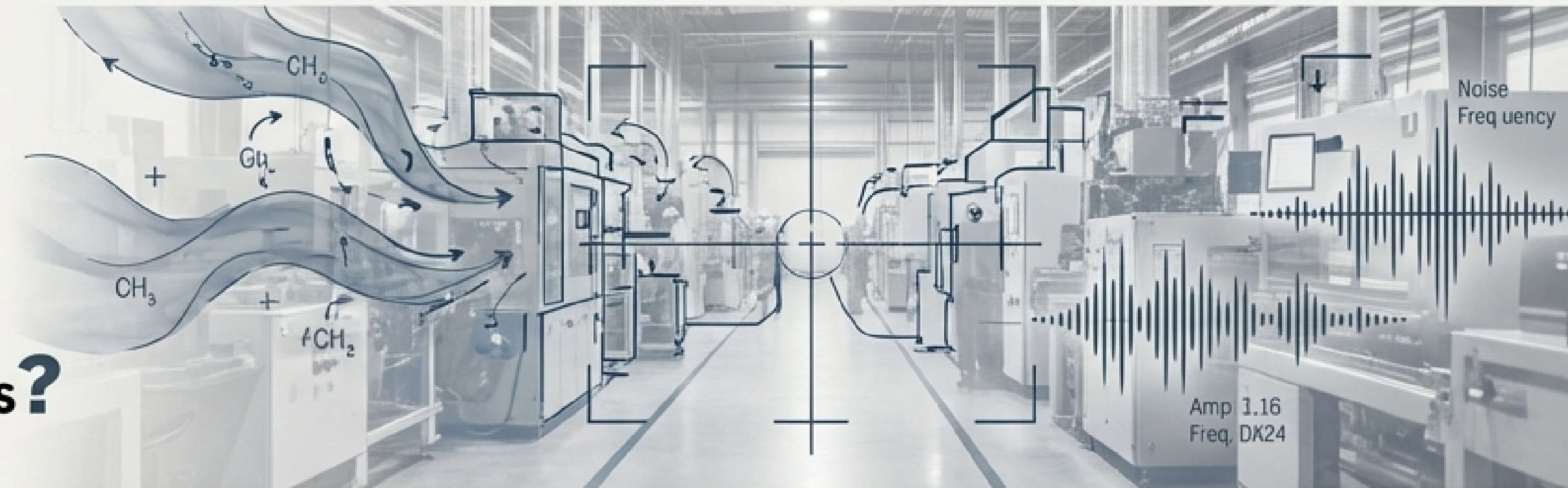

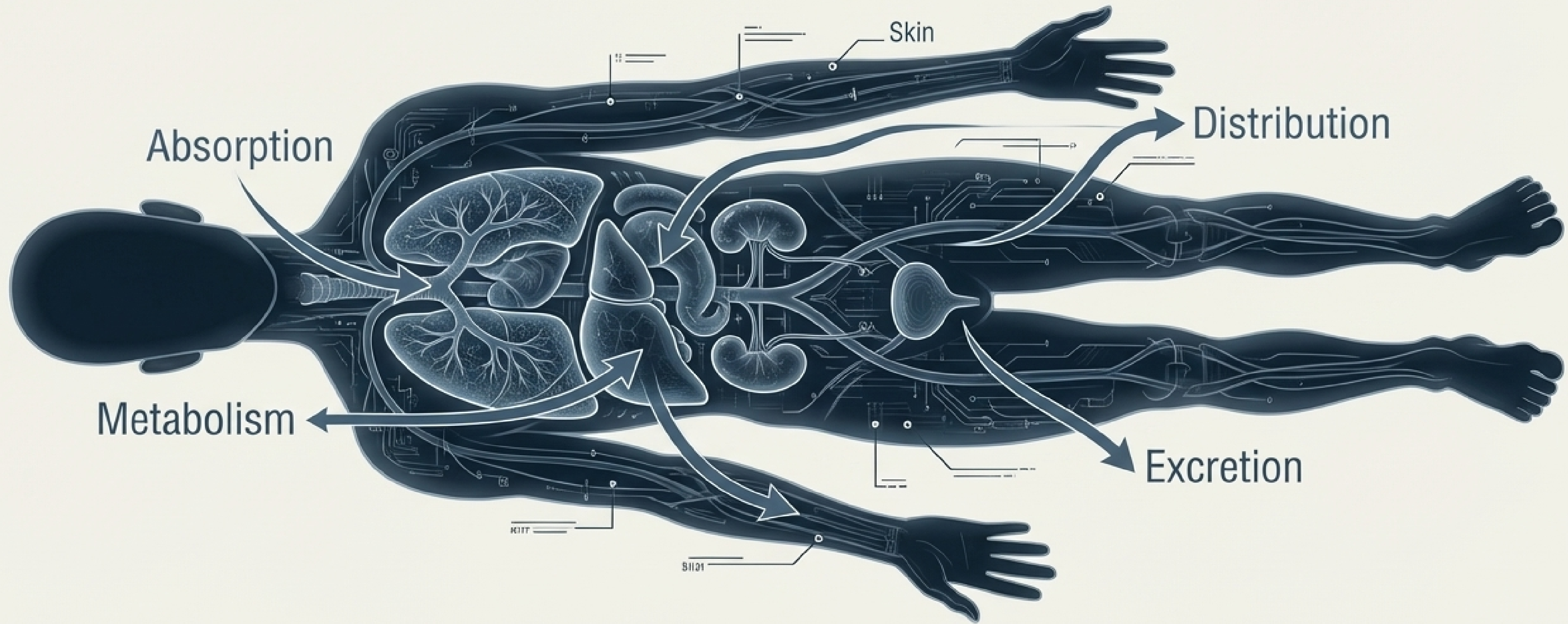

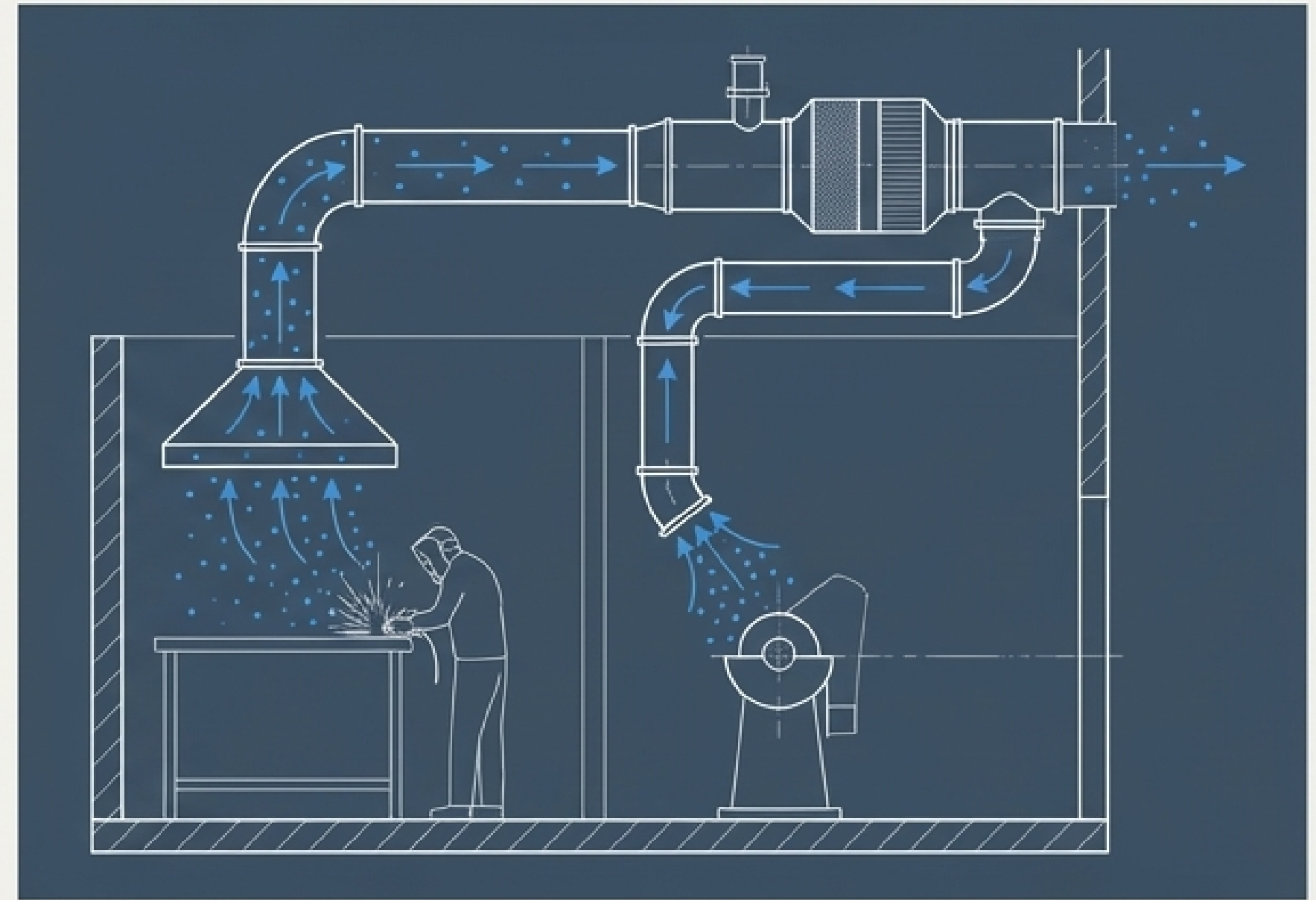
OHTA 505 (Control of Hazardous Substances) teaches Engineering Control. We must move beyond handing out masks.

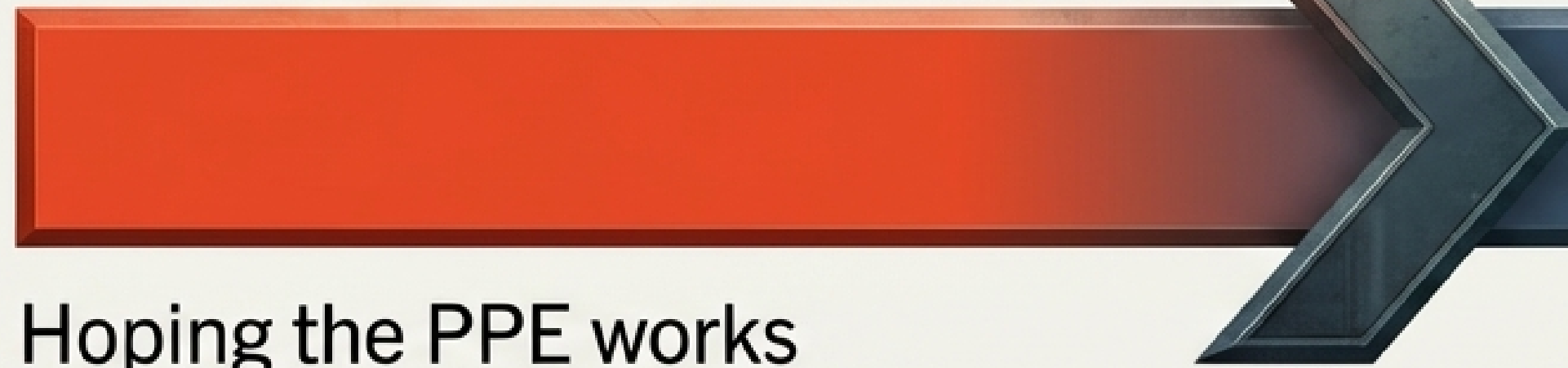

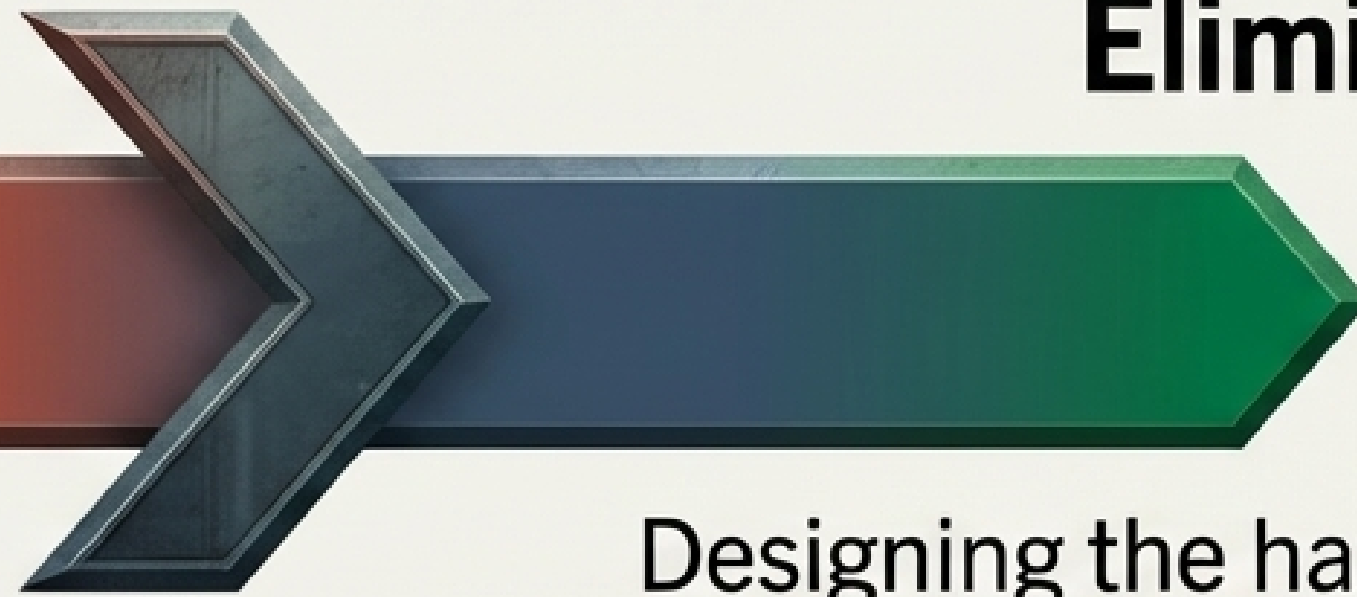

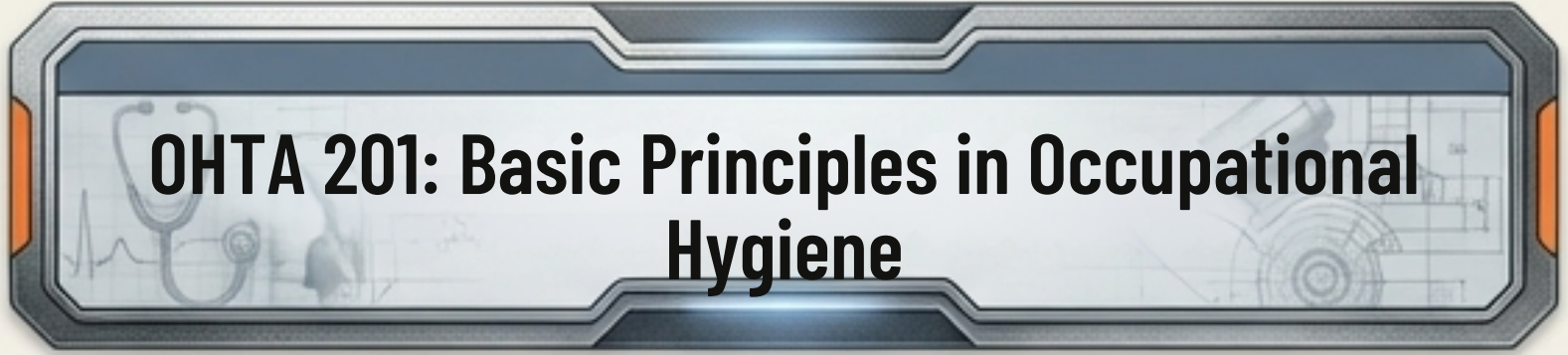
